en February 2, 2020 and June 20, 2020, at or near Anchorage, in the rict, State of Alaska, KHAM MONG YANG engaged in conduct ne to defraud one or more persons of \$10,000 or to obtain \$10,000 or more persons by false or fraudulent pretense, representation, or ned property or services in accordance with the scheme to wit:

ch is a class B felony offense being contrary to and in violation of AS against the peace and dignity of the State of Alaska.

COUNT IV

en February 4, 2020 and June 20, 2020, in the Third Judicial District, or near Anchorage, KHAM MONG YANG committed the crime of of the property or services was \$750 or more.

th is a class C felony offense being contrary to and in violation of AS against the peace and dignity of the State of Alaska.

COUNT V

en February 2, 2020 and June 20, 2020 at or near Anchorage, in the ict, State of Alaska, KHAM MONG YANG committed the crime of of the property or services was \$250 or more but less than \$750.

h is a class A misdemeanor offense being contrary to and in violation 1) and against the peace and dignity of the State of Alaska.

COUNT VI

That between February 2, 2020 and June 20, 2020, in the Third Judicial District, 25 State of Alaska, at or near Anchorage, KHAM MONG YANG knowingly made a false 26 entry or falsely altered a medical assistance record. 27

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All of which is a class A misdemeanor offense being contrary to and in violation of AS47.05.210(a)(5) and against the peace and dignity of the State of Alaska.

The undersigned swears under oath this Information is based upon a review of Medicaid Fraud Control Unit (MFCU) report 0971007 submitted to date.

6 On August 8, 2020 Killian Holden, Health Program Manager II, Senior & 7 Disabilities Services - Quality Assurance Unit provided a Medicaid Program Integrity 8 Referral to the Alaska Medicaid Fraud Control Unit (MFCU). According to the referral 9 provider KHAM YANG who was enrolled with the Medicaid Program as Personal Care 10 Attendant (PC) and who was working with an agency called McKinley Services had been submitting claims to the Medicaid Program for services when the enrolled recipient was 11 physically out of state. According to the referral the enrolled recipient M.C. left Alaska 12 in February or March of 2020, but YANG had continued to bill for services through to 13 June 20, 2020. Neither SDS-QA nor McKinley services had been able to find either 14 YANG or M.C. in Alaska. QA's overpayment recovery estimate was \$16,750.80 for 15 billing between 02/02/2020 and 06/20/2020. 16

MFCU Investigator Don McLeod was assigned to this investigation. Inv. McLeod found that YANG had been incarcerated at the Anchorage Jail between 12/13/2019 and 2/4/2020. Inv. McLeod learned through airlines records that M.C. had departed Alaska and travelled to Minneapolis, MN on 1/12/2020. M.C.'s son picked her up and drove her to their home in Wausau, WI to live there.

Investigator McLeod contacted the Wisconsin MFCU for a case assist.
Wisconsin MFCU had a local contact, Sgt. Chue Thao of the Appleton, WI police
department who is fluent in Hmong language. Sgt. Thao of the Appleton, WI police
department and Special Agent Ken Folkers of the Wisconsin MFCU interviewed M.C. on
April 21, 2021 M.C. in Wisconsin. The investigators showed time sheets for PCA
services that YANG had submitted to McKinley Services for payment through the
Medicaid Program between February 2 and June 20 of 2020. On those forms that YANG

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had submitted there are entries for the recipient's signature in support of the other details about the course of treatment that is represented on each day's time sheet. For example "She has a left elbow pain" or "She feel sick today." The time sheets were completed as if M.C. had signed the forms as the recipient of the services. However, M.C. told Agent 4 Folkers that she did not sign the forms, the signatures were not hers and that she had never seen those time sheets, and that she had been in Wisconsin on the dates those time sheets had been signed.

7 On April 21, 2021 Sgt. Thao and Agent Folkers also interviewed YANG in 8 Wisconsin. YANG admitted to forging all of M.C.'s signatures on each of the time 9 sheets he submitted for payment for PCA services he never performed for M.C. He 10 further admitted that he knew M.C. was in Wisconsin at the time he billed for the 11 payments and that he did not provide those services for M.C. YANG admitted that he knew what he was doing was wrong and against the law and stated that he had just been 12 released from jail in Alaska and needed money so he could have a place to live. YANG 13 requested to be able to write a statement which Agent Folkers allowed him to do. 14 YANG informed Agent Folkers "I wrong – I did wrong – I pay money back – (or) do 15 time in jail." YANG stated that he missed a court date in Alaska in December 2019 and 16 was incarcerated from December 13, 2019 and was released on February 04, 2020. Yang 17 remained in Alaska for the next 9 months and lived on the street in a tent for the last 5 18 months. Subsequently YANG returned to Wisconsin as well.

19 Inv. McLeod examined the time sheets and the claims provided by Senior 20 Disability Services and calculated the total amount paid by Medicaid to be \$16,750.80. 21 Inv. McLeod confirmed this with the Medicaid Billing Portal showing that YANG had 22 billed the program for the full amount of Consumer-Directed Personal Care Services that 23 M.C. was authorized to receive between February 2, 2020 and June 20, 2020, 24 representing maximum billing for services that were never provided.

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
